Classes

Opportunity Classes follow USEF rule GR821. *They are for entry level riders*. Competitors entered in only these classes are exempt from the USEF drug fee but are subject to and must comply with the drugs and medications rules and are subject to drug testing. They are not required to have federation membership numbers for the horse, rider, and owner but are required to supply federation numbers if they have them. Cross entry into Introductory A, B & C recognized classes is allowed, but no other cross entry classes are allowed. Opportunity class entries follow the same rules as recognized classes in limiting classes entered to two consecutive levels. If a competitor is entered in both opportunity classes and recognized classes, then all fees and membership requirements apply.

Rules and Regulations

- LEVELS:** Introductory through Grand Prix Level, Freestyle, Equitation and Materiale. Greystone Dressage is governed by the rules and specifications of the current USEF Rule Book and the current USDF Region Rule Book. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current USEF rulebook will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.
- USEF Membership Statement:** Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent, at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes
- ENTRIES:** Initial closing for entries is 15 days before the show. A fully signed waiver, entry agreement, correct fees, vaccine proof, negative coggins, safesport and all membership cards must accompany each entry form. Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable association numbers (USEF, USDF) for horse, owner, rider, trainer and coach, before the day of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards. Verification cards can be obtained at <http://www.eqverification.org/>
- CHANGES ON ENTRIES OR RIDE TIMES:** All changes on the entry form after the initial closing date will be subject to a change fee of \$25 per change requested. Changes requested on ride times after the preliminary schedule is posted will be subject to a change fee of \$25 per change requested. All changes will be subject to approval by Show Management.
- SCRATCHES AND CANCELLATIONS:** Scratches made prior to the initial closing date will be refunded less the office fee, entry fee and stabling fees. It is the competitor's responsibility to call (931) 452-9225 and EMAIL before the initial closing date to be eligible for a refund. There will be no refunds after the initial closing date. NO REFUND OR CREDITS of any entry fees will be given in the event a class or classes, or all or part of the competition is cancelled due to severe weather or other emergency conditions. NO SHOWS forfeit all of their entry fees.

6. POST LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE INITIAL CLOSING DATE, if schedule allows, and will be charged a \$35 late entry fee.

7. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY: Every horse and pony entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but the horse show management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show, the officials, the show employees, the show facility, it's Directors, and Employees, USEF, it's Directors and Employees harmless for any loss or accident to his horse, horses or equipment which may occur from accident, sickness, fire or otherwise. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine or divide classes, or to change officials as it deems necessary, decision of Show Management is final. Failure to enter ring by scheduled time may incur elimination. This is the responsibility of the exhibitor. Score sheets will only be given to riders or their authorized representative after results have been posted.

8. CLASS LIST INFORMATION: Classes are recognized by the US Equestrian Federation and the USDF. Opportunity classes are unrecognized. Management reserves the right to combine classes.

9. ACCEPTANCE OF ENTRIES: Entries will be accepted by mail, fax, email or via online entry system. No other criteria will be ACCEPTED. Entries and Payment must be received by the initial closing date if electronically submitted and mailed entries must be post marked by the initial closing date to avoid late fees.

10. REFUSAL OF ENTRIES: Entries of persons suspended or expelled from the Federation will be refused. The Management has the right to refuse entries of an exhibitor or participation of any Rider, Owner, Trainer or Coach who has shown objectionable attitude or behavior at a recognized competition towards its management, which management is able to substantiate, or previous unsportsmanlike behavior at a Recognized Competition which management is able to substantiate. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges, officials, management, show staff, farm staff or other competitors on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

11. PRIZES AND AWARDS: Ribbons will be awarded 1st through 6th place for all classes and divisions, Open, Adult Amateur and Junior/Young Rider for Training through Grand Prix level. Introductory, Opportunity, Equitation, Materiale & Test of Choice classes will be pinned together, not by division or level, 1st through 6th place (DR126.2). High point ribbons and prizes for each shows top scorers will be awarded for the three divisions of Open, Adult Amateur and Junior/Young Rider with the eligible classes to include Training through Grand Prix level only (Freestyle, Introductory, Opportunity, Materiale and Equitation are not eligible for high point awards).

12. MINOR EXHIBITORS: Parents or guardians of minor exhibitors shall hold Greystone Dressage, the facility, management, officials, USEF and USDF harmless for injury to such minor. No child's entry blank shall be accepted unless it is signed by a parent or guardian. The signature of instructors, agents, or other unrelated persons will not be accepted. Junior riders are not allowed to ride stallions in the competition.

13. MANAGEMENT: The management reserves the right to itself interpret all questions and conditions in regard to or rising out of or incident to the show without claims for damages or recourse of any kind. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the horse show management and its decision will be final.

14. RETURNED CHECKS: All checks returned by the bank for any reason will be charged a fee of \$50. Accounts will be given 10 days to be paid in full with cash or cash equivalent or they will be turned into the USEF for further disciplinary action.

15. STABLING: Stabling is limited to 12 permanent stalls with doors, 8 stalls (12x12) in the Upper barn and 4 stalls (12x14) in the Lower barn, contact Kim for availability. There are NO shavings included with the stabling fees, you must purchase shavings or bring your own commercially bagged brand shavings. No pelleted shavings allowed at the facility.

16. GROUNDS: Exhibitors may park (car and trailer) only in specified areas. ABSOLUTELY NO DOGS ARE ALLOWED on show grounds. Only those horses entered in the show will be permitted in the competition and warm-up areas during the competition.

17. ARENAS & LUNGING: The warm up is in the indoor arena with Tru Tex footing, competition arena is 20m x 60m setup in the outdoor arena with river and lime sand footing. There is a 50 foot round pen designated lunging area.

18. SCHEDULING: Ride Times will be available online at Fox Village <http://www.foxvillage.com> and emailed to the riders email address as listed on the entry form. A preliminary schedule of ride times will be posted the weekend before the show. The final schedule will be posted by noon on Friday the day before the show. Management will give riders competing on different horses 50 minutes in between rides on different horses, unless the competitor has agreed in writing to a shorter interval.

19. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, a bio-hazardous medical waste container will be provided in the office area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. Competition management may fine any individual including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

20. USEF fees for 2024 are \$23.00 (\$15.00 drug & medications fee and \$8.00 administrative fee)

21. Motorized Vehicle Statement - Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

22. Opportunity Classes follow USEF rule GR821. They are for entry level riders. Competitors entered in only these classes are exempt from the USEF drug fee but are subject to and must comply with the drugs and medications rules and are subject to drug testing. They are not required to have federation membership numbers for the horse, rider, owner, trainer and coach, but are required to supply federation numbers if they have them. Cross entry is only allowed into introductory classes. If a competitor is entered in both opportunity classes and introductory classes then the drug fee will apply.

23. NON COMPETING GUEST HORSE ENTRIES are welcome. Submit a completed entry form with a \$20 non competing fee, \$50 office fee, \$20 facility fee, \$25 haul in fee and the \$15 Entry fee (entry fee is donated to Stolen Horse International if all paperwork is complete by the closing date), a signed waiver, a signed entry agreement, vaccine proof and negative coggins. Competing horses will take preference over guest horses if warm up areas are crowded.

24. BIOSECURITY PROCEDURES (ISOLATION PROTOCOL) - In case of infectious disease the horse will be immediately moved to the owner/competitors trailer and transported to the veterinary hospital by the owner/competitor.

25. Bridle Numbers: must be worn at all times on the show grounds, including non competing horses.

26. Scores: it is the competitor's responsibility to verify the accuracy of all scores. Scoring errors must be reported to the show secretary within one hour of official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day.

27. Coggins Tests & Vaccine Proof: negative coggins within the past 12 months is required. The negative coggins certificate must list the same horse name and description as is listed on the entry blank and on the USEF horse identification or recording documents. Failure to provide will result in elimination without return of fees. Proof of vaccines, Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis), given within 6 months prior to entering the show grounds per USEF GR845 must be submitted with your entry. Competition Management and the facility, Maple Dell Ranch, will assume no responsibility for the health of horses at the competition. Competitors/Owners are warned they enter horses at their own risk.

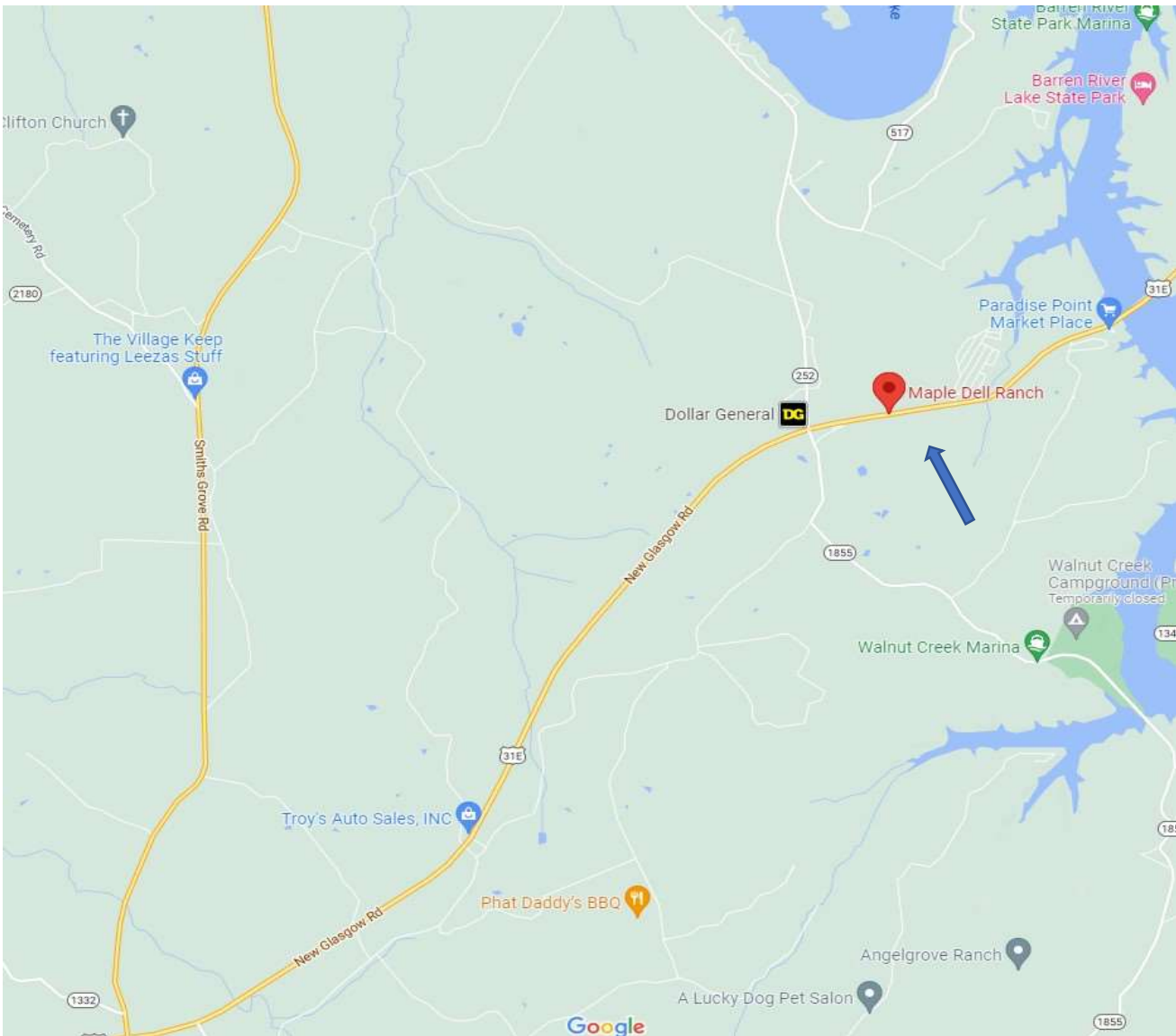
28. Safe Sport: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the US Center for SafeSport training requirements to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants MUST adhere to the US Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete prevention Policies.

29. NOTICE TO ALL ATTENDEES AND PARTICIPANTS: *There may be photographers taking pictures and video during the event, approved by show management. With your entrance to the show, you are giving permission for Greystone Dressage, Greystone Dressage Show Services, show management and Maple Dell Ranch to use any photos and/or videos of you and/or your horse which might appear in future promotional materials or advertising used for Greystone Dressage and Maple Dell Ranch.*

30. DR120.1.1 Protective Headgear. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet, which meets or exceeds current ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para Dressage tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until the headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear may be the same as or a coordinating color with the coat, and may include contrast coloring, accent, and crystal decoration. See DR136 for dress code rules for exhibitions.

31. Dress / Attire: for these Level 1 competitions, following DR120.1.2 Coats and Jackets....Only riders competing in Level 1 dressage competitions or in Opportunity classes are not required to wear a riding jacket or coat. DR120.1.5 Shirts and Neckwear, shirts with tie, choker, stock tie, or integrated stand up collar are required. Ties, chokers or stock ties may be any color. If jackets or coats are not worn per DR120.1.2 and DR120.2.1, shirts may be any color, must have sleeves and a collar, and separate removable neckwear is prohibited.

Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program

The USDF Regional Adult Amateur Equitation Program recognizes adult amateurs competing in equitation and promotes correct seat, position, and use of the aids in dressage. An Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class presented by Big Dee's Tack and Vet Supply will be held in conjunction with each of the nine USDF Regional Dressage Championship competitions, providing adult amateurs with additional opportunity for recognition. Ribbons awarded through 8th Place and gift certificates awarded to top four riders.

Adult amateurs wishing to qualify to compete in an Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final may do so by meeting the following requirements.

Qualifying Requirements

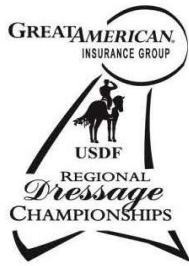
To be eligible for the USDF Adult Amateur Equitation Regional Final class, rider must have

- Earned a score of 70% or higher in any dressage seat equitation class (except walk/trot) at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Dressage competition within the qualifying period of the applicable regional championship.
- or*
- Qualified to compete in any regional dressage championship class (excluding freestyles).

Membership Requirements

- Rider must have a USDF Participating Membership at the time the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Rider must be an adult amateur, in accordance with GR1306 of the USEF rules, and be designated with USEF as an adult amateur when the score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Owner must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.
- Horse must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration when the qualifying score is earned, and at the time of the Regional Final class.

2024 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at www.usdf.org. Please refer to the 2024 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF. For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both USEF and USDF.

* PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. FEI Junior and FEI Young Rider classes have only one respective division.

The minimum percentages are as follows:

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$90), 5-years (\$360), or life (\$1,800). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$72). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program and the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$240) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$35 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$35). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$80. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$115) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of individual members and over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

COVID-19 Infection Information:

Participants will be expected to monitor their temperature 24 hours prior to arrival on competition grounds. Any person who has a temperature of 99.5° F (37.5° C) or higher or has symptoms of COVID-19 cannot enter the competition grounds. Additionally, except for healthcare personnel who have treated patients using appropriate medical-grade PPE during the course of performing professional duties, anyone who has been in contact with a person who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days cannot enter the competition grounds. Please read the following symptoms related to COVID-19 as well as the at-risk populations to make an informed decision on attending this competition. COVID-19 Symptoms: Cough, Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, Fever, Chills, Muscle pain, Sore throat, New loss of taste or smell.
